Narrative

A 69 year-old Worcester County deer hunter fell 20 feet to the ground while climbing into his "home made" lock on tree stand. Victim received 2 broken vertebrae and a broken rib. Non-fatal.

A 37 year-old Queen Anne's County deer hunter fell 16 feet from his tree stand when he fell asleep. He was not wearing a safety harness. Victim received a broken wrist, neck and back injuries. Non-fatal

A 45 year-old Frederick County deer hunter was shot with a 30/30 rifle by his 10 year-old son when the boy aimed at a deer through the scope and did not realize that the muzzle was in direct line with the father's shoulder. Non-fatal

A 63 year-old Kent County deer hunter fell 12 feet when he was exiting a permanent tree stand with numerous defects. The victim was in a harness while hunting, however, he removed the harness to exit the tree. His knee gave way when he put his weight on a step and he fell sustaining numerous bruises. Non-fatal

A 53 year-old Montgomery County Deer hunter fell from his tree stand and was asphyxiated by his harness. Fatal

A 53 year-old Frederick County deer hunter fell from his tree stand and received unknown injuries. Non-fatal

A 59 year-old Frederick Count deer hunter fell 15 feet receiving an injury to his right ankle. Non-fatal.

A 58 year-old Kent County deer hunter's shotgun fell while he was reaching for it at the base of a tree. The firearm discharged twice, striking the victim once in the foot. Non-fatal.

A 41 year-old St. Mary's County deer hunter was shot by his 41 year-old hunting partner during a deer drive when a deer ran between the victim and shooter. Due to dense brush the shooter did not see the victim. Victim received one buckshot pellet to the arm. Non-fatal.

A 72 year old Washington County Turkey hunter was shot in the face, chest and hand by a 33 year old who did not see the victim in full camo beyond the moving turkey. Non-fatal.
